BREAST CANCER 3-DAY

It's time to lace up your shoes and join the fight against breast cancer, a disease that will affect one in eight women this year. In its sixth year in Chicago and taking place in 14 other cities nationwide, the Breast Cancer 3-Day is a series of three-day, 60-mile walks that raise millions of dollars for breast cancer research, education and community health programs.

Participants raise money and walk an average of 20 miles a day, educating tens of thousands of people about breast health with every step. It's a great opportunity to team up with friends or meet new people. Walkers spend all day together, then return to camp to bond over hot meals, upbeat entertainment and cozy pink two-person sleeping tents.
